1. Downloading given order from the website of Hon'ble Jharkhand High Court or Hon'ble Supreme Court of India
2. Typing the decisive part of the order
3. Indicating name of the Court, Bench, Case No., Petitioner & Respondent, Name of Petitioners/ Respondents Advocate(s), Date of Order, Nature: Civil/ Criminal/ Revenue.
4. Indicating whether the Order is final or interim
5. Indicating in whose favour the case is decided; in case of final order.
